The photo is the refuelling station for a taxi company in China. They have 22,000 taxis. All of them are electric. That's twice the number of electric cars in Australia. This charging station has 637 fast charging stations. They charge 5,000 cars a day.

It consumes 160 mwh of power a day, equivalent to 10,000 homes.

Meanwhile it is big news in Australia when it is planned to increase the number of fast charging stations in Qld from 17 to 50.
